Do any four of the following:

- _____ 1. Recognize the International Symbol of Accessibility and point out places where this sign is found.
- _____ 2. Discuss with your leader how building entrances, water fountains, elevators, public telephones and washrooms, and sidewalk corner curbs can be made more accessible to persons in wheelchairs.
- _____ 3. Visit your library and find out how books are made available for visually impaired people.
- _____ 4. Meet with a social worker, agency representative or knowledgeable adult as to what services are available in your community to people with various disabilities.
- _____ 5. Talk to your gym teacher, Parks and Recreation department or leader about how disabled persons participate and compete in various sports.
- _____ 6. Talk to a representative from the phone company, TV station or other knowledgeable adult about what services are available for the hearing impaired.
- _____ 7. Find out what American Sign Language (ASL) is. Learn some sign language and how to sign your name.
- _____ 8. Where possible, meet with a disabled person and talk about that person's personal interests and activities.
